Work accomplished this year:

1. The Committee reviewed and approved 32 new undergraduate courses:

2. The Chair approved the following Special Topics Courses:

EN 210, Special Topics: Roots of English Poetry MA 395 and MA 495, Special Topics in Mathematics PY 281, Special Topics in Psychology PS 390, Condensed Matter Physics TA 300A, Theatre Administration and Management EN 100, Modern Catholic Authors RS 299, Catholic Intellectual Tradition

- 3. The Committee reviewed and endorsed the MFA five-year review.
- 4. The Committee reviewed and approved the changes to the American Studies Curriculum.
- 5. The Committee reviewed and approved the changes to the Physics program requirements. Specifically, the Physics C Advanced Placement exam will be allowed as a prerequisite for Modern Physics.
- 6. The Committee reviewed and approved the proposed major in Environmental Studies.
- 7. The Committee reviewed and endorsed the five-year review for the M.A. in Communication.
- 8. The A & SCC approved language on department review of interdisciplinary New Course Proposals. When an interdisciplinary course draws heavily upon the materials of a particular discipline, the Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee recommends that the New Course Proposal form be reviewed at a regularly scheduled meeting of the relevant department before it is reviewed by the interdisciplinary committee. The purpose of this review is to draw upon expertise of the department to evaluate and improve the proposal.
- 9. There is an additional new course proposal form that must be submitted with a new course proposal. The Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee decided to add a check-box on the new course proposal form. This box must

be checked if there will be no IDEA evaluation, and one must offer a rational as to why the IDEA form will not be used.

10. As part of the paperless course submission process, ITS purchased a product called "Axiom". They will develop a prototype for the Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee by the end of June.
