Dear Colleagues,

Welcome to the start of another academic year from your Faculty Welfare Committee/AAUP! The Executive Committee of the FWC/ AAUP has been hard at work this Fall working with the Faculty Salary Committee and planning this year's FWC/AAUP events.

Our campaign "We Are One Fairfield" continues with an event supporting Campus Equity Week this Tuesday, October 29th from 4:30 – 6:00 p.m. in BCC 200. We turn the spotlight on issues facing part-time Fairfield faculty. Their issues are our concern as we imagine One Fairfield for the good of our students, academic excellence, and the future of higher education in the United States where 75% of all faculty work on contingent contracts. The findings and recommendations in a Task Force Report on part-time Fairfield faculty presented to the Academic Council this October will frame this event. A roundtable will kick off a discussion and brainstorming session about further actions for all members of our community – students, faculty (full and part-time!), and staff. More information about this event appears on page 3 of this newsletter. A flyer for your office door to show your support of Campus Equity Week and part-time faculty colleagues is on page 4. Join us this Tuesday – bring a colleague, invite your students, and reach out to staff.

We are also planning Brown Bag Lunch Events on pressing issues for our membership. These include the transition to Aetna as the administrator of our current medical/pharmacy plan, and information on the "unbundled" components - dental plans and improvements to the vision plan. The FWC is working closely with the FSC to provide support for faculty during this change in the administrative carrier of our health care. A membership campaign to inform faculty about the value of joining the FWC/AAUP at the campus, state, and national level will continue throughout the Fall.

I look forward to joining with you all during this academic year to advance the call "We Are One Fairfield" and the cause of Campus Equity for all members of our Fairfield community. The number of contingent faculty (adjunct and non-tenure track) has grown from 43% in 1974 to 65% in 2005.
