Fairfield University Credit Information for Language Students in the 2020 Dartmouth College Rassias Center Summer Intensive Courses

- 1) Three (3) credits from Fairfield University will be awarded upon successful completion of the required components: the Rassias Center's virtual Intensive Courses and the simultaneous Independent Study with a Fairfield University mentor, the instructor of record for the credit-based course. Students are responsible for determining whether Fairfield University credit for their course is transferable to any particular institution's program for which they may desire to use it;
- 2) The student must take both Intensive Course sessions, and in the same language (Week One and Week Two: July 6-10 and July 13-17, 2020);
- 3) Eligible courses are Elementary I & II, Intermediate I & II for Brazilian Portuguese, French, German, Italian, Russian and Spanish, depending upon Fairfield instructor availability. To self-place, please use the following URL originally developed for the on-campus Accelerated Language Programs (ALPs): http://www.faculty.fairfield.edu/jgoldfield/ALPselfplacement.pdf. If you have already taken a language course for college credit, you would normally need the next in sequence for it to be accepted in a degree program;
- 4) Students interested in credit should inquire about credit with Dr. Joel Goldfield at Fairfield University (**jgoldfield@fairfield.edu**) as soon as possible to check on the availability of a Fairfield University mentor in their language. Credit students will need to be registered online at Fairfield by Tuesday, June 30, 2020. The summer tuition rate is \$775 per credit, and the registration fee is \$50;
- 5) Orientation to the Fairfield University credit-based course will take place with the Fairfield instructor of record prior to the first day of Week One of the Rassias Center Intensive Course;
- 6) Students will work with the Fairfield instructor on a daily basis for matters of homework, culture, and tutoring, such as before each day's first Master Class and after the last one;
- 7) An oral and written Final Exam will be administered to the student by the Fairfield instructor of record (mentor) within three days of the conclusion of the Week Two program, by July 20th;
- 8) Students who have successfully completed the credit program will have access to a Fairfield University grade report, and an official transcript will be available to be sent to other institutions for a small fee. The Rassias Center for World Languages and Cultures at Dartmouth College issues its own certificate of completion.
