If you want to reinforce and improve your language skills but have limited time, the WIP is the perfect program for you! In just three days you will learn more and noticeably improve your ability to speak the language.

## **About the Rassias Method**

"To Rassias, language is ritual celebration, a momentous, living theatre. He knows that emotion and rhythm and movement make people remember things." -Linnell Smith, The Baltimore Sun

The aim of the Rassias Method is to make the student feel comfortable and natural with the language in as short a time as possible. This is achieved through a series of specific teaching procedures, techniques, and tools that:

- Create and maintain a dynamic classroom pace and atmosphere, thus capturing student attention.
- Provide for unusually high student involvement in the use of the language (an average student response rate is 65 times per hour).
- Foster spontaneity of expression and creative use of the language, even in the earliest weeks of training.
- Help learners overcome their natural self-consciousness and fear of mistakes.
- Emphasize the relevance of the language to the student's own life and experience.

## **Program Details Language Levels**

Advanced beginner, low through high intermediate. Phone interview required. Interviews will be conducted within a week of registration. Confirmation of student participation sent one week prior to program commencement.

## Meals

Lunches with staff are part of the program and are included in the cost. Breakfast and dinner are at the student's expense. Transportation is not provided to these meals.
