#### I. Background Information on Sigma Xi

Sigma Xi, The Scientific Research Society, is an honor society of scientists and engineers that recognizes scientific achievement. The Fairfield University chapter was formed in 2000 and has members in biology, chemistry, engineering, math, psychology, and physics. Membership is open to any eligible scientists and engineers who identify Fairfield as their chapter (thus we have several members that are at other universities that do not have their own chapters as well as individuals in the community).

Each year, our chapter hosts talks on scientific topics, has an annual poster session where students present their research findings, and has an induction ceremony where new faculty and student members are initiated into the Society.

Other activities vary from year to year, such as co-sponsoring relevant events on campus, supporting science-related activities and initiatives, and developing new programs such as Science Cafes.

#### II. Elected Officers

<u>A. Election Procedures:</u> Elections are formally held for that academic year in the first meeting we have in the fall. The first meeting should be called by the outgoing president within the first

2-3 weeks of the start of classes. Thus far we have been using a rotating system where the current Secretary/Treasurer becomes President-Elect (Vice President), the President-Elect becomes President, and the President becomes Past-President. This requires getting a new person to start this 3-year cycle by being secretary/treasurer, though because the Annual Report to the national Sigma Xi organization requires a listing of officers for the upcoming year, people interested in becoming officers express their interest in May.

#### B. Responsibilities of Elected Officers

<u>President</u>: Solicit volunteers for committees at the first meeting in September; Ensure that committees understand their responsibilities and deadlines and maintain communication with them throughout the year; Send out find raising letter to various Fairfield departments and programs in early Fall; Submit lectureship subsidy application (due 3/1); Write letters of support on behalf of Sigma Xi when requested for science-related activities and initiatives on campus; Write the annual report for the national headquarters (due in June); Plan and promote any new initiatives; Enlist an officer to attend the annual meeting of Sigma Xi at least once every 3 years and submit a report (Kraig Steffen attended the conference in Orlando in 2007)

<u>President-Elect (Vice President)</u>: Assist the President in various activities; Develop future plans for ways to maintain and further develop the Chapter's activities

<u>Secretary/Treasurer:</u> Approve funding requests (for talks, for inductions, etc.); Keep notes of meetings and activities to be used in the President's annual report

<u>Past President:</u> Maintain communication with current officers to ensure that they understand their responsibilities and that the chapter continues to function smoothly

<u>Executive Administrator</u>: Since 2000, Laura Dancho has generously donated her time and energy to maintain records of the Chapter's activities, paperwork, and website. She also is deeply involved in many of the behind-the-scenes elements (arranging rooms for the events, sending out announcements of activities, ordering and setting up tables and boards for the poster session, ordering membership certificates from Sigma Xi, and a million other things). She keeps an email distribution list of members as well. Please keep in mind that this position is purely voluntary and is uncompensated.

#### III. Committees

There are three main committees that are necessary for the smooth running of this chapter. Volunteers are solicited at the start of the academic year from the Sigma Xi members.

#### A. Lecture and Events Committee

This committee plans and organizes several of our major events.

(a) Talks by Fairfield Faculty Sigma Xi Members: We typically have a talk given by a faculty member who was inducted in the recent year. Often this committee selects someone in the spring to induct, with the understanding that the individual will give a talk in the fall or following spring. This is often a relatively new faculty member (e.g., in their 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year here), though targeting people who have been around longer than that is a good idea to get them active in our organization as well.

(b) Talks by Outside Speakers: There are two avenues for this. 1. To host a talk by someone listed on the national lecture circuit listed at the national Sigma Xi website. These talks need to be planned in advance, because the Lectureship Subsidy Application is due March 1<sup>st</sup> each year for the following academic year. Therefore, this committee should meet in late January to discuss amongst themselves as to particular talks of interest (they may also seek the advice of the general membership), and then pass this information along to the president so that he or she can submit the subsidy application in a timely fashion. 2. The other avenue is to review the membership list and invite members who are from the community or other local universities to give a talk.

#### (c) The Annual Poster Session

The annual poster session is generally held the last Thursday of April. It is important to have this as late in the semester as possible so that students have time to complete collecting and analyzing their data. The committee needs to select a date for this event and a date when submissions are due for review and communicate this information to the university (not just to Sigma Xi members; this event is open to all). The submissions should be due at least one week before the event, to allow time to have the abstracts printed and bound in a program.

#### (d) The Annual Induction Brunch

This event is typically held on the Tuesday of Senior Week. The Lecture and Events Committee needs to plan for the event by selecting and publicizing a date, reserving a room, and ensuring that facilities are in order for this event.

#### Nominations and Membership Committee

The committee is responsible for nominations to membership and reviewing and implementing means to maintain members. The committee sends out a call in early March for nominations for students and faculty alike that will be due in late March. The committee needs to review these applications, and then the Executive Administrator sends them to the national headquarters for

processing and printing up of certificates. The committee should be thinking about ways to get more faculty as members in our chapter (perhaps by invitations for talks – work with the Lectures and Events committee on this). Because attrition of student members is an ongoing constant, maintaining a solid group of dedicated faculty members is essential. Any ideas of how to do this should be discussed.

#### Refreshments Committee

This committee is responsible for arranging food and drinks for the various Sigma Xi activities (lectures, poster session, and brunch). Arrangements can be made directly through Sodexo or through other sources. In addition to ordering the refreshments, this committee needs to ensure that the refreshments are set up and cleaned up.
